- 6. Does anything about the main character's mental state, behavior, world view, or faith, as evidenced by his/her thoughts, statements, and actions, strike you as particularly noteworthy, unusual, or interesting?
- 7. What comment is the author trying to make about the culture of the characters in this story?
- 8. One way to think about the significance of a film is by assessing the power of its commentary on the human condition. What comment is being made in this movie about what it is to be human?
- 9. Since film is a composition of images, which specific shots reveal something important to the story line? Describe the shot and explain its contribution to the story.
